Dear Parents

It's amazing that we've already reached October half-term but it's been a busy start to the school year. The Reception and Nursery children who joined us in September have made such a fantastic start to school but they are definitely ready for the opportunity to recharge their batteries next week.

I'd also like to say a big, 'well done' to Mrs Glen. Her tireless and tenacious work on the school travel plan has resulted in Turnfurlong Infant School being awarded Platinum level accreditation.

This week at school, the children in Year 1 have been to Limes Avenue Baptist church to support their learning in RE. We've also been learning about the stories of ordinary and extraordinary black people in assembly, in particular the story of The Empire Windrush. OPAL – Outdoor play and learning project

This year we are starting a new project at school that should transform the children's experience of lunchtime and playtime. It's called 'OPAL' and the letters stand for the 'Outdoor play and learning project'. We are starting the process of collecting resources for the children to play with and this is where we need the support of our fabulous school community. We've attached a list of things that we are looking out for to this email. Everything we are collecting will be second-hand, surplus or pre-loved so now's the time for a clear out.

Please bring your items to school in the week beginning Monday 30th October, either at drop off or collection time so that they can be taken to the hall foyer or roundhouse. Thank you.

We will start to introduce the changes to playtime and lunchtime from January 2024. We'll be inviting parents to sessions to explain more about the project in the Spring term so look out for further information in the coming weeks.

Risk assessment and educational visits

Thank you to all the parents, grandparents and carers who have helped us on educational visits this term. These experiences really help to make the children's learning at school memorable and meaningful. The benefits are many but we know that visits outside support children's vocabulary, broaden their life experience and cultural capital and are an enriching social experience. Thank you for helping us make this happen.

In schools, all visits and experiences are carefully risk assessed and plans are submitted for approval in advance. Even a short walk to the post box with Reception is planned with great care. Risks can change and therefore plans will always be amended where it is

necessary to do so. This can include a visit leader making a change on the visit itself or cancelling a visit at short notice on health and safety grounds.

We would not routinely plan to carry water on shorter local outings, such as the library visit, unless temperatures were particularly high. In these circumstances sunscreen and hats would also be required. The decision to take these could be made on the day itself if weather conditions had changed.

When children are eating lunch, because they are out for the day, they will take water bottles with them. However, on all educational visits staff will also be aware of the need to make reasonable adjustments for individual children or adults, including volunteers, who have health care plans in place.

Finally, I'd like to thank the staff who have taken children out on visits this term. Taking children out of school on educational visits is so worthwhile but it is always a huge responsibility.

Little Acorns Art – FoTIS fundraising

A card template is being sent home with children today, to be completed over half term. Little Acorns Art will turn the artwork into a card, keepsake or gift idea, and parents will be able to purchase their child's art printed on various products. The cards can be decorated and used for occasions other than Christmas, such as thank you or birthday cards.

All your child needs to do to is create their design on the form using felt tips or coloured pencils, but avoiding pastel colours, glitter and ordinary pencil – the bolder and brighter the better! Put a cross in the right box to indicate which way is up. Additional forms are available at the school office after half term if replacement forms are needed. Please try to keep completed artwork flat, as creasing will affect the end product.
