

Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL)

- Suitcases of any size and type
- Anything on wheels/castors
- Plastic milk crates, supermarket delivery crates, plastic bread trays
- Briefcases, especially hard cased ones
- Road signs and cones
- Metal kitchen pots, pans, baking trays, utensils, wooden spoons, chopping boards
- Garden tools like small spades, shovels, trowels and brooms
- Pipes – rigid and flexible drainage pipes of varying sizes, and fittings
- Buckets, tub trugs
- Keyboards, torches, laptops, calculators, mobile phones, desk phones, webcams, cameras (that are no longer working)
- Fabric (large sheets, duvets, old saris, brightly coloured fabric)
- Body boards, camping roll mats, yoga mats
- Metal frames or den building kits
- Cable drums
- Guttering and clips
- Noodles (the type you use in the swimming pool)
- Hats, helmets, scarves, jazzy shirts, elasticated skirts, waistcoats, wedding dresses, character costumes, masks, snorkels, handbags for dressing up and role play
- Large pegs (to help to set up dens)
- Fold up work benches, hammers, screwdrivers, spanners
- Plastic barrels or old water butts
- Bricks, scaffold boards
- Log stumps (for seating or stepping logs for an obstacle course)
- Old horse tack, saddles
- Steering wheels, loose wheels from bikes or go karts
- Diggers, dumper trucks, large outdoor plastic toys
- Sets of Duplo, stickle bricks
- A boat or canoe (with or without oars!)
- Garden gnomes or resin animals
- Trolleys, tents, shower curtains with animal, leaf or scene prints for backdrops
- Outgrown wellies, waterproof trousers or rain coats
- Old, solar powered water features or pond liners, sprinklers
- Jugs, measuring spoons and cylinders, scales for water play
- Buckets, spades, sand play objects
