# Applications for Reception and Year 3 school places in September 2024

If your child is in Year 2 you must apply for their Year 3 school place at Junior school. If your child is in Nursery, and they were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2019 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020, you must apply for a Reception place.

You must submit your application to Buckinghamshire Council by Monday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024. #### Diarrhoea and Vomiting – 48 hours

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting must stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours). Tummy bugs can spread very quickly around school and please note that the 48 hour policy also applies to staff.

#### **Chickenpox and Scarlet Fever**

We've had a few cases of chickenpox in school, which isn't unusual for this time of year. If your child does get chickenpox they should stay off school until all their spots have crusted over. That normally happens about five days after the spots first appear.

If your child has scarlet fever, they will need to be prescribed antibiotics by their GP, otherwise they will be infectious for two to three weeks. They can come back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.
