







<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The UK is made up of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. The North Sea and Atlantic ocean surround the UK. London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast are their capital cities. Aylesbury is located within Buckinghamshire. A settlement is where someone lives. Settlements can be a hamlet, village, town or city. Physical features are naturally occurring areas of land, such as rivers, forest, hills, mountains. Human features have been added to the land by people over time, for example, stone walls, buildings, roads. 		Hamlet	Human settlement smaller than a town. Mainly rural. Can be farms, mills, mines or harbours.
		Village	Settlement bigger than a hamlet but smaller than a town.
		Town	Settlement larger than a village but smaller than a city.
		City	A densely populated, urban area with public spaces.
